End Violence Against Women International (EVAWI) is a non-profit organization dedicated to the vision of a world where gender-based violence is unacceptable; where perpetrators are held accountable, and victims receive the compassion, support, and justice they deserve. Our mission is to inspire and educate those who respond to gender-based violence, equipping them with the knowledge and tools they need to support victims and hold perpetrators accountable. We promote victim-centered, multi-disciplinary collaboration, which strengthens the response of the criminal justice system, other professionals, allies, and the general public -- making communities safer. As the Director of Research, my duties include: developing grant proposals; providing various forms of information and technical assistance to researchers, practitioners, and policymakers; and facilitating training workshops for multidisciplinary audiences of professionals within such diverse fields as law enforcement, victim advocacy, health care, prosecution, and related disciplines.

Training: Current activities of EVAWI International focus on two major grant initiatives. First, with federal funding from the Office on Violence Against Women (a division of the U.S. Department of Justice), we have launched an OnLine Training Institute (OLTI) for practitioners on the topic of criminal justice and coordinated community response to crimes of non-stranger sexual assault. I serve as the primary author for training content and also lead the development of curriculum elements such as review exercises, test questions, practical applications, and other interactive elements. Training is also provided through annual live conferences.

Technical Assistance: The second major grant initiative is also funded by the Office on Violence Against Women, to provide technical assistance for professionals in the area of forensic compliance, helping them to design and implement a response system for their community that is compliant with the revised medical forensic exam requirements of the Violence Against Women Act of 2005, 42 U.S.C. § 3796gg-4(d). This act, often referred to as "VAWA 2005," was designed to ensure that victims of sexual assault have access to a medical forensic exam free of charge or with full reimbursement regardless of whether they report the crime to law enforcement or otherwise cooperate with the criminal justice system. All states and territories must now certify (as of January 5, 2009) that they are in compliance with these requirements, yet the challenges they face in achieving compliance have been described as "monumental" (*Forensic Compliance Toolkit*, 2009, p. 4).

The purpose of this grant was to develop a training curriculum for law enforcement professionals in sexual assault investigation, with particular emphasis on cases involving known offenders (i.e., non-strangers). After completing the development of the curriculum, I then hosted two national "train-the-trainer" workshops to certify individuals from around the country who could implement the program in their state or region. Responsibilities also included administering a budget of over \$280,000 and completing all federal reporting requirements.
