Professional Experience

Dr. Branaman has extensive experience with adults and juveniles in counseling and mental health settings including institutional settings, public schools, hospitals, residential and outpatient treatment, and private practice. His professional experience includes teaching, consulting, administrative, and clinical experience. He served three years as Department Head for an inpatient addiction treatment program for adults and adolescents.
